

2014-2015 Georgia FCCLA Statesman Award

Overview

The purpose of the **Statesman Award** is to recognize students for their knowledge of FCCLA and Georgia FCCLA. Students will be administered a multiple choice test using a scantron form. Students must score **at least 85%** to receive the Statesman Award. Students receiving the Statesman Award will be recognized during the Awards Ceremony. There is no limit to the number of students per school to compete in this test. Students can still compete in this test even if they compete in other events offered.

General Requirements

All Georgia FCCLA Competitive Events participants must be state and nationally affiliated members of their FCCLA chapter. Participants must register for and attend the entire conference to officially enter the competitive events. The cost to participate in the Statesman Award Event is *\$5 per participant*.

Registration

To register for the Statesman Award, you must first register for student registration and click "Event" next to their name once they are registered. You will then click "Statesman Award".

State Recognition

All participants will receive a certificate of participation.

All Statesmen Award recipients receiving 85% or higher will receive a **Georgia FCCLA Statesman Lapel Pin** and be recognized on stage.

Three Levels of Recognition

- Statesman Pin
- Distinguished Statesman Pin
- Adviser Statesman Pin

Event Information

The Statesman Award test will take place on twice this year:

- Thursday, September 18 at 4:00pm and 5:00pm at the FFA-FCCLA Center in Covington
- Sunday, March 22 at 2:00pm, 3:00pm and 4:00pm at the Classic Center in Athens

Students will have one hour to answer 50 multiple choice questions. Distinguished Statesman will be for students that have previously already received the Statesman Pin. Distinguished Statesman will have an additional essay set of questions. Advisers may also take the Statesman Test this year. After students

complete the test they may leave the testing area. After one hour, all remaining tests will be taken up. Test questions will be pulled from the National FCCLA website <u>www.fcclainc.org</u> and the Georgia FCCLA website <u>www.gafccla.com</u>. Student should study state and national programs, membership information, news and media, awards, history, etc. Students will not be allowed to bring any study materials into the testing room. Pencils will be provided.
