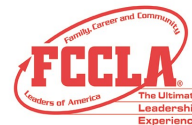

Today there are over 160,000 members in more than 5,400 chapters active in a network of associations in 47 states, as well as the District of Columbia, the Virgin Islands, and Puerto Rico.

In the 2016-2017 school year, Georgia FCCLA boasted over 22,463 members in 298 chapters; Second largest in the nation!

At Marietta High School, we currently have 95 active members and have earned the distinction of Honor Roll Chapter for five years in a row.
