What are the different Levels?

1

Level 1 – Grades through 8

If you are a middle school chapter, all of your competitors will be Level 1.... Even if it is a 6th Grader working with an 8th grader.

2

Level 2 – 9th and 10th Grade

If a freshman and a sophomore work together, they will still be considered Level 2 event though they are not in the same grade.

3

Level 3 – 11th and 12th Grade

If you are working on a team event and a senior or junior is in your group, you are a Level 3 competitor. Even if the partner is a freshman.
